Lone Star Reunion 2011 Austin, Texas

When high winds caused cancellation of the flights in the World War II trainers, the group was very interested in giving it another try. Because it is easier to round up the old warbirds in the Austin area, that will be the headquarters for the 2011 reunion. We will be staying in the center of the city near downtown, the state headquarters and the University of Texas. We will spend one day at local Austin tourist sites – the State Capital and the State of Texas Museum.

As for the flying, we will travel to the town of Burnet (35 miles away) where the Highland Lakes Squadron of the Commemorative Air Force is arranging a day of flying along with a "burger burn" for lunch. Flight priority will be given to our veterans, but after they fly, all family members will be welcome to experience a little stick and rudder time in the same planes our veterans first took to the skies.

Each pilot/owner of the planes we will use is volunteering his time and plane. They are doing so to honor the 506th Fighter Group veterans and their families. Normally flights like the ones we are offering would be \$200 to \$400. Our WWII veterans will be provided the flights at NO CHARGE. However, to cover the fuel cost for this effort, we are asking reunion family members who wish to fly, to contribute \$100 for each flight they take. Additionally some planes have insurance that require the passengers to be at least 18.

So, when you sign up for the reunion, indicate which planes your family members wish to fly and reserve your flight. Reservations are necessary so we will have enough airplanes. Additionally, priority will go to those who are first to send in their reunion reservation. Because we have the challenge of weather and the availability of airplanes, we will not ask for your \$100 fee until it is time to fly.

What else is there to do at the reunion? Well Austin is known as the *Live Music Capital of the World*. So, each night you will have a lot of options if you like music. If unique and free strike your fancy, at dusk each evening 1½ million bats emerge from under a downtown bridge to blanket the sky as they head out to forage for food. You knew everything was bigger in Texas – now it's time to come check it out!

Texas Reunion 2010

At the 2010 reunion, held in the Dallas/Ft. Worth area, we had a total of 45 folks attending. As was the case at the 2006 reunion, the F-16 pilots were terrific host to our veterans and their families.

We had also planned a day of flying in World War II trainers (Stearmans and AT-6 Texans), but Mother Nature didn't cooperate. On both the day before and the day of the scheduled flights, winds were 25 gusting to 40 and the old airplanes couldn't even taxi out of their hangars. To fill the day still surrounded by old airplanes, most of our members visited the Cavanaugh Flight Museum in Dallas where they have a major collection of warbirds — everything from World War One prop planes to more modern jets.
