Kick up your heals in the Lone Star State April 29th — May 2nd

Texas returns to center stage for the 2010 reunion. It was back in '06 that our World War II veterans and families were hosted by the 457th Fighter Squadron at their home in Fort Worth. It was one of the most unforgettable reunions for our members and the group was eager to return. The parts of the prior reunion that were most memorable were the tour of Lockheed, the ride on the KC-135 as the F-16 refueled, and the honor and respect lavished on our veterans by the pilots who were currently defending our country.

In fact, it was the warm reception and admiration bestowed on the Iwo Jima veterans by those who had just returned from fighting in the Middle East that was most appreciated by our members and their families. While the 506th Fighter Group could easily be described the last fighter pilots of World War II to go to war and the first forgotten, the reunion in '06 made clear that their memory and honor is strongly acknowledged by the current members of the 457th.

For 2010 the weekend selected for the reunion sees Lockheed unavailable for tours and we can assume cutback in budget will not allow a repeat of the refueling adventure. However, we are planning on taking our members and their families flying. More importantly we will continue the tradition started in '06 of allowing our pilots who flew in the days of propellers to share combat stories with the guys who now fly jets.



Veterans & Their Families to Fly Vintage WWII Planes

In past reunions the families have heard the countless flying stories from our veterans (memories we will always cherish). We have had the opportunity to see a new fighter being built and watched them being refueled in the air. We have attended past reunions where we have been able to see vintage planes fly and to hear the roar of those mighty engines from over 60 years ago.

This year, we are going allow our veterans to re-experience their days of learning to fly. To let them take the controls in the air like they did in their youth, to see if their stick and rudder skills return and to remember what it was like to become a fighter pilot. And for the families, each member will have an opportunity to experience what it is like to fly in the same planes their fathers and grandfathers first took to the sky.

So, how is it going to work? Well on Friday April 30th, as a replacement for the Lockheed tour, we will travel to a small, local airport. An assortment of WWII trainers will be on hand for us to fly. Our veterans will have the first opportunity to fly and will all be expected to show off what they remember from their flight training days. After that, every family member with an interest in flying will be given a chance to take one of these planes up with our crew of experienced pilots. Once in the air, you will be given the opportunity to take the controls or just enjoy the ride.

While some details of these flights are still a work in process, there are a few items that are clear. Each pilot/owner of the planes we will use, is volunteering his time and plane. They are doing so to honor the 506th Fighter Group veterans and their families. Normally flights like the ones we are offerin would be \$200 to \$400. Our WWII veterans will be provided the flights at NO CHARGE. However, to cover the fuel cost for this effort, we are asking reunion family members, who wish to fly, contribute \$100 for each flight they take. Additionally some of the planes have insurance that restricts the passengers to be at least 18.

So, when you sign up for the reunion, indicate which planes your family members wish to fly and reserve for a flight. Reservations are necessary so we will have enough airplanes. Additionally, priority will go to those who are first to send in their reunion reservation. Because we have the challenge of weather and the availability of airplanes, we will not ask for your \$100 fee until it is time to fly.

This should be a fun day of flying. We all want to watch our veterans have this experience and each member attending the reunion should seriously consider this to be an excellent opportunity to see what it is like to fly one of these vintage planes. Please sign up for the reunion early and take advantage of this day of flying.
